## Instructions for the submission of abstracts to the AVTRW Annual Conference 17 - 20 March 2008

Copies of this form may be downloaded from the AVTRW web site ([www.avtrw.org.uk](http://www.avtrw.org.uk)). This form must be used to submit both **abstracts** and **supplementary information** to the conference organiser. Since over half of the papers to be presented at the Conference will not relate to the themes identified in the call for abstracts, please use the specifications below to define your abstract.

### Abstracts:

(Following the precise instructions for the submission of abstracts will greatly assist processing of abstracts. An example of the form that abstracts should take is given below)

The abstract should then contain identifiable sections, as follows:

*Introduction*

*Materials and Methods*

*Results*

*Discussion/Conclusions*

Note: Abstracts which comment that “results will be discussed” may not be accepted

1. Abstracts should consist of a short title (no more than 20 words) and a list of the authors and their addresses followed by an abstract **no more than 200 words in length - title, authors and addresses are NOT part of this word-count**. The organiser reserves the right to shorten abstracts where this guideline is broken. Please include one email address with the abstract.
2. Use either the abstract form on the rear of this page or, **preferably**, e-mail (see instructions overleaf).
3. Use single spacing, font size 12, Times New Roman typeface. Use lower case for title and end with a full stop - **do not embolden**. **Capitalise** initials and first letter of names of authors. Initials should **follow** surname. **Do not** list degrees. Add an asterisk (\*) after name of **person presenting paper** (double asterisk if presented by a non-member).
4. Continue with brief address. Where multiple authors come from a number of establishments please link author and address by superscripted numerals. **Leave blank line** between address and abstract.
5. Start text of abstract on **new line without** indentation using entire width of box. Write abstract in the style indicated above. Acknowledgements may be included, where appropriate.
6. Provide all details shown below, plus abstract, as an e-mail message (with Word attachment) to ([l.fallon@vet.gla.ac.uk](mailto:l.fallon@vet.gla.ac.uk)).
7. The abstract may be submitted as an attachment (preferably Microsoft Word 6.0/95, 97 or 2000).
